Infection Control Standards: Our presenter, Dwight Krauss is a Dental Therapy Instructor at FNUniv-National School of Dental Therapy. Dwight is a 1980 graduate of the National School of Dental Therapy, Fort Smith, NT. Upon graduation he provided dental care in Waglisla, BC from 1980 to 1982. He then provided dental care in Goodfish Lake, Saddle Lake and Kehewin, AB from 1982 to 1986. From 1986 to the present, Dwight has been an instructor at the National School of Dental Therapy at Prince Albert, SK. Dwight currently teaches Administration, Infection Control and Treatment Planning. He has taught Infection Control since 1991. Dwight has been a member of the Organization for Safety & Asepsis Procedures (OSAP) since 1992 and attends their annual symposium on a regular basis.

Routines of a good infection control protocol may inadvertently become "lost" or compromised over time.
